LPBC OUTREACH

Beginning on or around October 24th, through Canada Post, we will be sending a very special message of hope to 6,158 homes in the neighborhood around the Lorne Park Baptist Church building.

The packet called, *Finding the Hope*, will communicate who Jesus Christ is and the hope that we can have in Him.

The packet itself, which will be delivered to these homes, contains one *Finding the Hope* booklet, a letter of introduction with a tear-off response card, and a return envelope. Also included will be an insert containing the name and contact information of our church, a warm invitation to connect with us through our family-based programs, and various community events.

Think of this as a significant seed-sowing effort. The "seed" is the Gospel. The field is the area just mentioned. By means of the postal service, we are able to plant that "seed" in the "soil" of people's lives.

Please pray:

1. That God will prepare the hearts of people in this community to receive the Gospel message.
2. That they will connect with our church, where they can grow in their relationship with Christ.

3. That we will all look for opportunities to share Christ's grace and truth with people in our community. Ask people if they received the packet and what they think about it.

Let us pray in faith that this Gospel saturation mailing will bear much fruit for the Kingdom of God.
